News

Training. Safety and Technical Workgroups all met at Seawork last month, using the time to highlight to stakeholders outside the membership what each group had been up to and showcasing their latest developments.

Training Workgroup: The group kicked off the week's activities at the ABP Head Offices in Southampton, a full room of attendees discussed the small commercial vessel skills and workforce challenges, new towage training and the digitalisation of the WA's training services.

Safety Workgroup: Following its 2025 safety campaign, the workgroup hosted an open session on finger and hand injuries. Supported by Traffi gloves, the discussion focused on protecting from injury, how the simplest of injuries can lead to significant trauma, and the latest advances in glove design.

Technical Workgroup: MCA Small Craft Codes, were the agenda of the public session on Thursday of Seawork. Andy Page hosted the MCA and CA's on the stage to discuss the implementation of the new Sport and Pleasure Code and the transition to Workboat Code edition 3. A lively debate pushed the session to its maximum time limitation and a healthy discussion was had by all involved.

Competition Winners and Further Funding Clean Maritime Hub

The Department for Trasnport recently announced the winners of the Clean Maritime Demonstration Competition (CMDC6), allocating £30m to 71 projects across the UK to conduct demonstrations, predeployment trials and feasibility studies in clean maritime solutions. The projects will run from September 2025 to March 2026.

They are also announcing a further £3.85m for the Clean Maritime Research Hub in 2025 to conduct further research and to install a novel liquid hydrogen facility at Durham University for maritime.

The Minister for Maritime is in the West Coast of Scotland for the announcement. He is meeting with Smart Green Shipping, a recipient of CMDC3 funding, who have successfully demonstrated their wingsail technology, FastRig.

The UK Emissions Trading Scheme (UK ETS) Authority has published an interim response to the 2024 UK ETS Expansion to Maritime consultation. The response can be found HERE.

Response details:

The response contains key details on the expansion to maritime. It includes:

- Our intention to launch the UK ETS Maritime regime on 1 July 2026.
- The scope, which will include UK domestic journeys and emissions while in UK ports for vessels of 5000 gross tonnage (GT) and above.
- Details on MRV requirements and who is responsible for complying with the scheme.

We are issuing this interim response to enable operators to prepare for the scheme. This is in recognition of stakeholder concerns in consultation responses that they would have insufficient time to understand their obligations and prepare.
